

A vibrant civic space is compulsory for democracy

Denying rights to freedom of expression is detrimental to the growth of any society. However, we often find those who hold power in trust get jittery about the checks and balances a robust civic space guarantee. Hence, those in authority often work to hush voices that disagree. When there is an attempt to repress or suppress the people, the media along with other custodians of the rule of law have a duty to speak out.

Among those who hold authorities accountable, the media leads. Within the media, investigative reporters are duty bearers. This position makes journalists and media houses premeditated targets of actions that restrict freedom of expression despite the several laws that uphold this fundamental human right.



Still, a vibrant civic space is compulsory for democracy, good governance and social justice which those vying for positions of authority often promise to win elections, but conveniently forget once they get into office. The government of, for, and by the people, cannot be with hushed voices and attacks of people's freedom to speak, associate, dialogue, debate, question, organise and protest.

As we build up to World Press Freedom Day on 3rd May, this platform provides an avenue for respectful and balanced conversations on the who, what, where, when, how, why and so what, of hushed voices in the civic space and the role of the media in the mix.
